From the Founder's Archives...

This week, students will begin to reflect and honor the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Here are excerpts from speeches that continue to inspire hope, justice, and peace:

"Courage faces fear and thereby masters it. Cowardice represses fear and is thereby mastered by it. Courageous men never lose the zest for living even though their life situation is zestless; cowardly men, overwhelmed by the uncertainties of life, lose the will to live. We must constantly build dykes of courage to hold back the flood of fear."

"Many people fear nothing more terribly than to take a position which stands out sharply and clearly from the prevailing opinion. The tendency of most is to adopt a view that is so ambiguous that it will include everything and so popular that it will include everybody. Not a few men who cherish lofty and noble ideals hide them under a bushel for fear of being different."

"We must accept finite disappointment, but we must never lose infinite hope."

"I have the audacity to believe that peoples everywhere can have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality, and freedom for their spirits. I believe that what self-centered men have torn down, other-centered men can build up."

Tuition for 2012-2013

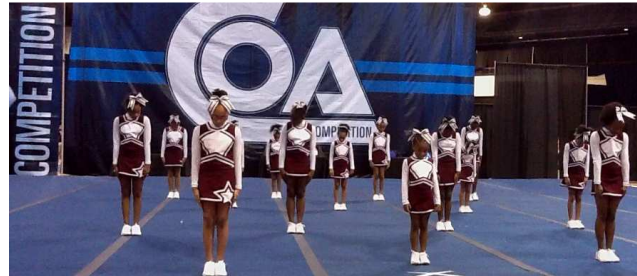
On Saturday, January 7, the Board of Directors approved the 2012-2013 Tuition Schedule and Fees. We are pleased to announce that tuition did not increase, neither was there an increase on any fees. Financial assistance will be more carefully audited and limits on financial assistance packages will be more strictly enforced.

Reenrollment Agreements

Reenrollment Agreements will be mailed/posted on January 10th. Reenrollment is not automatic. Families who do not meet the qualifications for reenrollment, such as delinquent parent hours, students on academic probation, for example, are likely to require a conference before receiving a reenrollment invitation.
